Hi everyone. Thank you for your time this evening. We wanted to start off by introducing ourselves.

My name is Ashley Clark. While I am not a resident of Penn Yan I am the Behavior Specialist at Penn Yan Central Schools and have a true passion for inclusion and equity for all.

Why Are We Here?



I wouldn't change you for the world, but I'd

Our purpose today lies in these faces... and so many others. Rorick, Reggie, Carter, and Elijah are all students of PYCSD and are all students who have Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

As parents and caregivers of these children we are here to advocate that we create a space that children, just like Rorick, Reggie, Carter and Elijah, can play freely without fear of serious injury and even death.

Why Are We Here?

Nearly 1/3 of reported ASD person cases related to wander/elopement from 2011-2016 ended in death or required medical attention.



Accidental drowning was responsible for over 70% of lethal outcomes followed by fatal traffic injury.

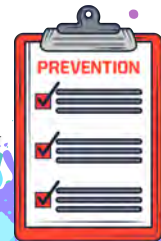

9 Children under 9 faced the highest lethal risk with wander/elopement cases ending in death 85% of the time.

Risk of death was highest during Spring and Summer with half of fatalities occurring from May to August.

Children with ASD are four more times likely to elope or wander than a typically developing child. 1 in 36 children have ASD in the United States.

In 2017 a study was published that looked specifically at the mortality and risk in children with Autism Spectrum Disorder with wandering and eloping. The study found that nearly 1/3 of reported cases of eloping and wandering in the ASD community ended with the child requiring immediate medical attention and/or death. 70% of the deaths of children with ASD resulting from eloping or wandering were due to drowning closely followed by fatal traffic injury. Children with ASD under 9 faced the highest lethal risk with wandering and eloping with 85% of those cases ending in death. Risk of death was highest during Spring and Summer with half of the fatalities occurring from May to August. This can be directly attributed to more outside activities.

So what does this have to do with you and with our community?

Our Hopes



A safe play space
for all children.



Penn Yan currently has no playgrounds that are 100% fenced in. This means that parents of children with ASD have no safe place to take their children to play without risking the chance of wandering and elopement which research has found ends in death or medical attention 85% of the time in children under 9 . Our hope is that we can work together to create a space where all children can play safely, practice social skills, develop their motor skills, and where parents can enjoy playing with their children instead of being on alert.



We would welcome continued discussion, learning, research, and planning on how to make an inclusive play space a reality.

RESOLUTION NO. 53-2024

TEMPORARILY RENAMING MACE ST TO VIETNAM VETERANS DRIVE IN HONOR OF THE WALL THAT HEALS WHILE IN PENN YAN

Motion by Trustee _____, seconded by Trustee _____ to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, “The Wall That Heals” will be arriving at the Penn Yan Fireman’s Field August 6th and displayed August 8th, 2024 to August 11th, 2024; and

WHEREAS, “The Wall That Heals” is a replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C., designed to travel throughout the United States. Since its dedication on Veterans Day 1996 it has been displayed at nearly 700 communities; and

WHEREAS, Penn Yan is the only location in New York State to host “The Wall That Heals” this year and is fortunate to have been chosen as a host site for a second time. The first time was in 2002 when it was displayed at the Johnson Costello American Legion Post 355; and

WHEREAS, “The Wall That Heals” is meant to serve as a reminder of the ultimate sacrifices made during the Vietnam War and bring the opportunity to view the memorial to people who may not be able to travel to our nation’s capital. Bringing the Wall to communities throughout our country allows the souls enshrined on the Memorial to exist once more among family and friends in the peace and comfort of familiar surroundings. The traveling exhibit provides thousands of veterans who have been unable to cope with the prospect of facing The Wall to find the strength and courage to do so within their own communities, thus allowing the healing process to begin; and

WHEREAS, “The Wall That Heals” will be in Penn Yan on two very important days. The first is August 7, 2024, also known as National Purple Heart Day, and the second is National Agent Orange Awareness Day Saturday August 10, 2024;

WHEREAS, the Penn Yan Village Board of Trustees seeks to honor the approximately 3 million men and women who served in Vietnam and particularly the 58,281 individuals whose names are etched on the Wall; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Penn Yan Village Board of Trustees officially welcomes the opportunity to display this important tribute to the men and women who gave their lives in service during the Vietnam War and extends sincere appreciation for the efforts of those who worked to bring this display to Penn Yan and encourages all its citizens to visit the Memorial during its time in Penn Yan and to volunteer to work with the organizers; and be it further

RESOLVED, that in honor of “The Wall That Heals” being hosted in Penn Yan, the Village Board of Trustees will temporarily rename Mace Street to Vietnam Veterans Drive August 6th, 2024 through August 11th, 2024.
